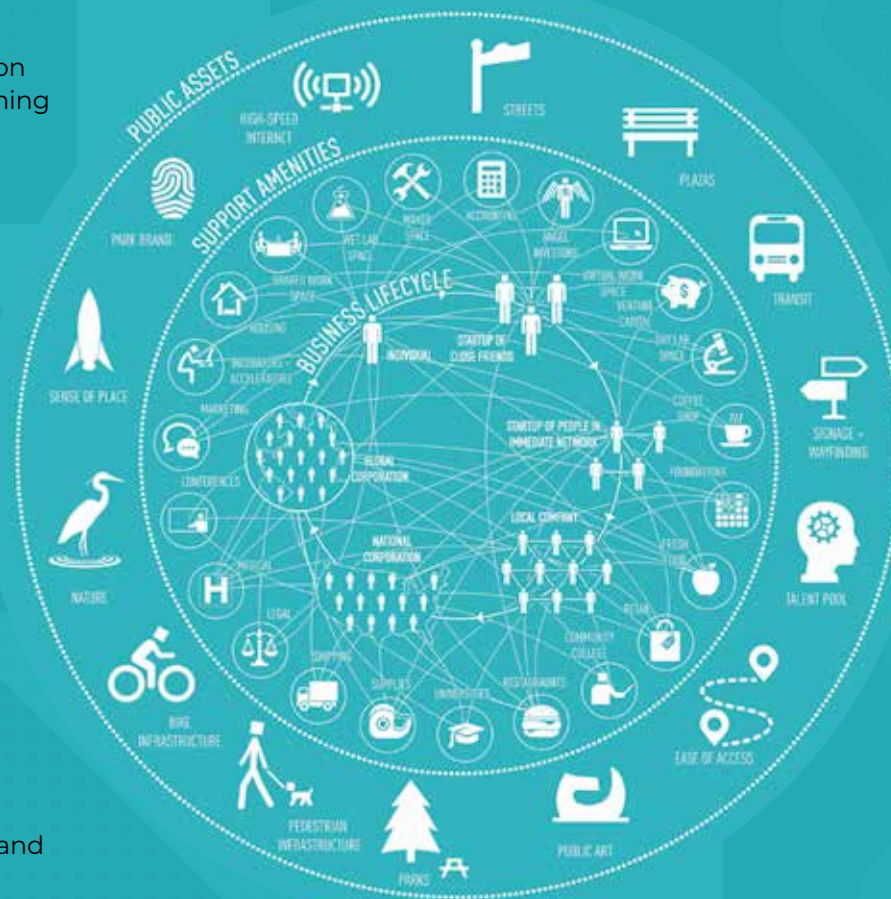
WHAT IS AURP?

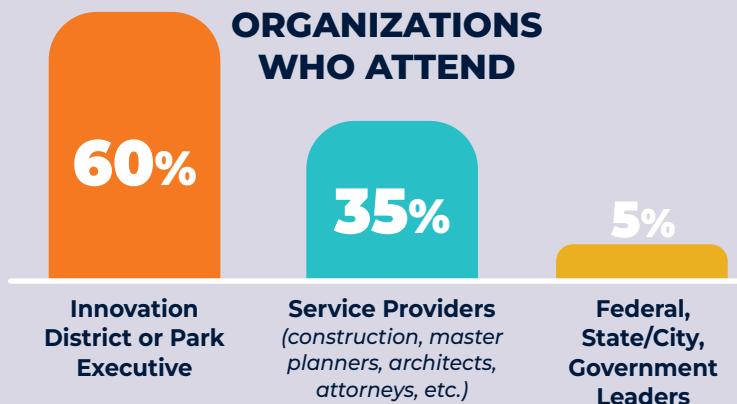
