Reporting directly to the vice president for research and working in tandem with the ODU Research Foundation Board of Trustees, the AVPR/ED manages the affairs of the ODU Research Foundation within the programmatic and fiscal policies of the Research Foundation and the University as well as extramural grant regulations. The AVPR/ED will have a demonstrated background of successful, ethical leadership and progressively greater business management responsibilities including financial, human resources, and risk management operations, as well as sponsored program management. The AVPR/ED must be naturally collaborative with the exceptional interpersonal and communications skills needed to partner effectively with university leaders, faculty and staff, a board of trustees, and numerous external funding partners and stakeholders including local, state, and federal agencies and not-for-profit organizations and industry. A Master's degree in business administration or related field OR an earned doctorate combined with active research experience as a principal investigator and/or oversight of research operations in an academic institution coupled with a minimum of five years of experience in a senior management position in sponsored program operations is required; research administration experience in higher education is preferred.
