AURP 2019 International Conference to Present New Report on the Evolution of Innovation Districts

Global Institute on Innovation Districts' Julie Wagner & Tom Osha to unveil "The Evolution of Innovation Districts: The New Geography of Global Innovation"

Tucson, Arizona, October 23, 2019 – The Association of University Research Parks (AURP), a global nonprofit membership organization serving the university and institutional research parks community, announced today the Global Institute on Innovation Districts will unveil its inaugural research report, "The Evolution of Innovation Districts: The New Geography of Global Innovation," at the AURP 2019 International Conference, November 4-7, in Atlanta.

The AURP 2019 International Conference, taking place at Georgia Tech's Tech Square research park, will bring together more than 200 research park and innovation district leaders from around the world for high-impact knowledge exchange and networking with the industry's premier experts and leaders.

In the conference's opening keynote session, **Tuesday, Nov. 5, 5:10pm**, Julie Wagner (President, Global Institute on Innovation Districts and President, Urban Insight) and Tom Osha (Board Chair, Global Institute on Innovation Districts and Senior Vice President, Innovation and Economic Development, with Wexford Science & Technology) will formally present the Global Institute's landmark report.

"This paper is being released at a critical moment in time given that entrepreneurial dynamism is slowing, national and state investments in cities in many countries are contracting, divisions by income and wealth are expanding, and efforts to mitigate climate change face political pushback," says the Global Institute's Julie Wagner.

Innovation districts, as defined by the Global Institute, are discrete, walkable areas where anchor institutions, firms, labs and related entities collaborate as a collective to increase their competitive potential to foster innovation and economic development. The Global Institute estimates roughly 100 innovation districts are emerging globally with 20 districts currently in operation in the US.

At the conference, Wagner and Osha will share insights from the report on how successful innovation districts are reaching their potential through deployment of strategies that leverage a district's economic, physical and social networking assets. Wagner and Osha also will talk about how successful innovation districts rely on organizational strategies and structures, particularly a strong governance model and coordinated finance.
