AURP to Work with SSTI to Accelerate Tech-Based Economic Development

AURP and SSTI to collaborate on new U.S. EDA program to create content and programming on how communities can develop research parks and innovation districts

Tucson, AZ, and College Park, MD, October 18, 2022 – [AURP](#), the leading nonprofit organization representing research parks and innovation districts, today announced the launch of a collaboration with the [State Science & Technology Institute](#) (SSTI) to join in implementing components of a new U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA) grant that aims to accelerate technology-based economic development (TBED) across the country.

Under EDA's [recently announced](#) award to form a TBED Community of Practice, AURP will collaborate with SSTI over a four-year period in developing practical education and training content – including online toolkits, interactive webinars and white papers – on planning, building or expanding research parks, innovation districts or regional collaborations.

“We’re delighted to work with our colleagues at SSTI to support communities in learning more about the power of research parks, innovation districts and tech hubs to drive innovation, economic growth and job creation,” said Vickie Palmer, CEO of AURP. “With this new EDA TBED Community of Practice program and with EDA’s \$1 billion Build Back Better Regional Challenge, AURP and its partners have the opportunity to empower regional communities to develop game-changing societal and economic growth opportunities in every part of the country.”

EDA’s overall Communities of Practice program aims to strengthen U.S. economic development infrastructure by capturing, organizing and scaling best practices at a national level. Community of Practice grantees (which include regional and local economic development organizations) benefit from a mix of peer-to-peer learning, issue-specific trainings and targeted coaching on economic development strategies.

“We are excited EDA is investing in the development of a TBED Community of Practice,” said Dan Berglund, President & CEO of SSTI. “This initiative will work to improve the impacts and capacities of EDA grantees, and we are pleased to be working with AURP to ensure that regions and organizations supported by EDA that incorporate research parks into their TBED strategies have access to AURP’s knowledge, experience and network to strengthen their efforts.”
